FACING JERUSALEM

Traditionally, synagogues throughout the world face the land of Israel. In Israel, they face Jerusalem. In Jerusalem, they turn towards the Old City, in the Old City, they face the Temple Mount. Imagine a magnet and a set of compasses, that's what the Jewish world looks like. All synagogues face Jerusalem.

The central feature of our new sanctuary is that it will now be oriented eastward, towards Jerusalem. Thus, as we go forward with our building, we will hearken back to the most basic norm of synagogue architecture of the last 2000 years.

The pragmatic consequence of re-orienting the synagogue along an east-west axis is that it will widen the sanctuary. A wider sanctuary (as opposed to a long and narrow one) will enable everyone to feel closer to the bimah and participate in the service with

greater ease. This will have a lasting impact on the congregation.

If you haven't seen the plans for the renovation of the synagogue, make a point of stopping in to see them. There's a lot to be excited about!

PURIM

The Jews ordained and took upon themselves, and upon their generations, that these days of Purim should not cease from among the Jews, nor the memory of them perish from among their descendants—to observe the days of Purim at their appropriate time. (Esther 9:27-31)

This verse in Megillat Esther is the source of the festival of Purim, celebrating our redemption from the hands of the wicked Haman. In a larger sense, Purim is the festival of "joy and light," celebrating not only the single event in the days of Mordechai and Esther, but rather the continuous miracle of the Jewish body

and soul.

THE OBSERVANCE OF PURIM, THE FAST OF ESTHER

Traditionally, the day before Purim, the 13th day of Adar, is a Fast Day to commemorate the fast proclaimed by Queen Esther, when advised by Mordechai of Haman's plans. Fasting was, and is, part of Jewish tradition in preparation of any serious problem or challenge.

CELEBRATING PURIM—THE FOUR MITZVOT

1. Reading Megillat Esther. On the evening of Purim and on the next morning, the Megillah is read from a parchment scroll, chanted according to a special cantillation (melody) used only in the reading of the Book of Esther.

2. The Seudah of Purim. On the day of Purim (so long as you begin anytime before nightfall), we celebrate with a festive meal.

3. Shalach Manot. We also express our joy and gladness of the miracle of Purim by Shalach Manot (sending portions) consisting of two types of food to our friends. We remember, as we celebrate our victory over the cruel Haman,

that we must depend on others if we are to survive in society.

4. Matanot La'evyonim (Gifts to the Needy). This is a mitzvah which requires us to give to at least two poor people, food or money, with which to celebrate the Mitzvot of Purim.

Purim is indeed a beautiful holiday—joyful, religious, yet full of humor, and responsible irreverence. Make this Purim a special one with your family in synagogue and at home.

CAN WE EVER FORGET THOSE WHO HAVE NO FRIENDS, RECEIVE NO GIFTS, AND HAVE LITTLE OF THEIR OWN—THE POOR IN OUR MIDST ARE TO BE REMEMBERED!

On Purim, as we celebrate our safety and victory, we must forever be cognizant of those less fortunate whose celebration and joy is diminished through the anguish of poverty and need. Therefore, Purim invites us to celebrate, not only with family and friends, but also to extend our hand to the poor. We are commanded to give gifts to them, as well as to our friends. Any fund for the poor offers you the opportunity to fulfill this mitzvah.

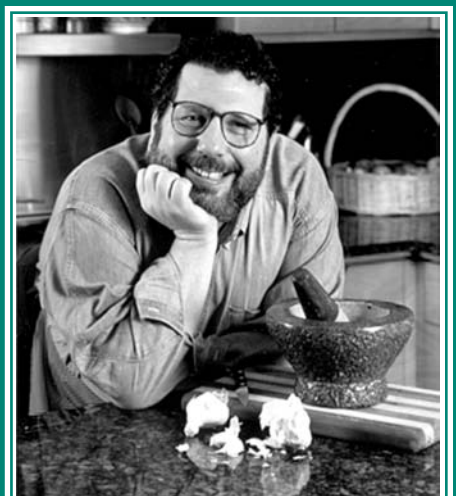
