Her 30-minute documentary *Tales of the Defeated*, won First Prize at the Jerusalem Film Festival. Her first full-length documentary *Farewell, Herr Schwarz*, won the Best Documentary Award at Haifa International Film Festival, was nominated for the Ofir, the Israeli Academy Award and won the Israeli Documentary Filmmakers Award. Yael lived in Highland Park for two years as a child while her father was doing his post doctorate at Rutgers.
