What is Reverse Tashlich?

It's a waterfront cleanup event for all ages, supported by the Conservative/Masorti Movement, to raise awareness about the deep Jewish connection to water, and reinforce the urgent moral imperative to protect our aquatic environment. It is our Rosh Hashanah tradition to symbolically cast our sins into the Raritan River. During our Reverse Tashlich we'll take out of the river and riverfront trash and debris, in our attempts to reverse the sin of polluting our environment.
