Frank has served in the leadership of many national and international organization's governing boards, including the US Holocaust Memorial Council and the Board of YIVO. She was selected as one of "The Fifty Most Influential Jews in the World" by the Jerusalem Post (2012) for her work on behalf of women around the world.
