## Hello Dear Friends and Deeply Valued Supporters,

On Sunday March 9th the Highland Park Conservative Temple-Congregation Anshe Emeth will hold their Gala 2025 Dinner, where I will serve as their Guest of Honor. I am deeply touched by this tribute from the temple and I hope you will consider joining me at this event or contributing to it.

To name a few, I am grateful for the dedicated service of our Councilman Matt Hale, Universal Access Commission co-chair Marlene Tarshish, HP Environmental Commission leader Michael Rosenberg, community activist Natalie Aloyets Artel, and especially, my mentor and our former Mayor, Gayle Brill Mittler. It does not surprise me that when a new leader with roots in the Jewish community steps up in the Borough, he or she often cites the Highland Park Conservative Temple-Congregation Anshe Emeth as their house of worship.

The Highland Park Conservative Temple-Congregation Anshe Emeth is also the source of a great deal of community service and human kindness in our community - what they will call Chesed (Good Works) and Tzedaka (Charity), but I will term as the best examples of Godly behavior in human society. They take good care of their own and they take good care of others in town too. The temple is an engine of good deeds in Highland Park.
